Annual Parish Meeting – 20th May 2021

Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held in Tintagel Social Hall.

1/5 2021	<p>In the absence of the Chairman, the Locum Clerk was asked to open the meeting.</p> <p><u>Speaker 1.</u> It was reported that the guide “Welcome to Tintagel” contained several inaccuracies, brought about mainly by the restrictions caused by Covid 19. Some stated prices could now be out of date, events planned have had to be cancelled, tariffs for accommodation may not be correct. It was felt this publication should be checked before being made available to visitors.</p> <p>It was noted that a mobile NatWest bank would park in the main car park, starting on June 4th on a weekly basis.</p> <p><u>Speaker 2.</u> The problems around parking in Trethevy and Bossiney were highlighted. Residents were in discussions with Cornwall Council Highways, who had been most helpful, to find a resolution to these problems. It was noted that cars were being parked in such a way as to block residents driveways, on grass verges, and on bends causing a hazard to other road users. A group of residents had been monitoring the situation, as had the owners of the Tea Rooms. It was to be hoped that the problems would be resolved before the main tourist season gets underway.</p> <p>A temporary parking restriction order was in place until 30th September after which time the Parish Council would need to apply for a permanent order at a cost in the region of £830, such an order would cover a period of 18 months. There are funding sources available through Cornwall Council to assist with this cost.</p> <p>Cornwall Councillor Barry Jordan expressed his pleasure at being elected to serve another term, and promised to work for the benefit of the residents as he was to be appointed as a liaison between Cornwall Council and Parish Councils. He said he would work with the Area Network Manager to reach out to Parish Councils and assist them, where possible, to deliver the projects and aims of Councils in this area.</p> <p><u>Speaker 3</u> was eager to see all the public toilets opened as soon as possible. It was their feeling that, with so many visitors to the Parish, these facilities were vital and there should be no further delay in re-opening them.</p> <p>The speaker also felt it was necessary to have the Tourist Information Centre re-opened and questioned whether the building could be re-opened under Covid 19 regulations. The Parish Council would put this suggestion</p>

An inventory of this building's assets was proposed.</p> <p><u>Speaker 4.</u> The speaker sought support from the Parish Council to allow a mobile butchery, they wished to set up, to park on Council land to purvey meat and poultry to customers on a regular schedule. Council agreed to discuss this request at the next meeting.</p> <p>Cornwall Councillor Dominic Fairman, Ward Councillor, congratulated the Parish Councillors on gaining their seats at the recent elections. He wished them all well for the tasks ahead of them. He said that they had many pressing items which needed attention and that this new Council should press ahead without delay to resolve historical issues and move forward. Several speakers then congratulated the Councillors on their appointment and wished them well for the future.</p> <p>Speaker 5 wanted to draw to Council's attention the problem of speeding drivers through Bossiney. Councillor Jordan suggested the a community speed watch could be set up to help with this problem.</p> <p>Council to discuss at their next meeting.
